

MC Escher and Tessellations



Maurits Cornelis Escher was born and grew up in the Netherlands, which is in Europe. He is known as M.C. Escher. He was the fourth and youngest son of a prosperous Dutch government civil engineer.

After failing his high school exams, Escher enrolled in the School for Architecture and Decorative Arts in Haarlem, the Netherlands. After only one week of school there, he informed his father that he would rather study graphic art instead of architecture. His graphic art teacher had seen his drawings and linoleum cuts, and encouraged Escher to continue with graphic arts. Escher considered this teacher to be a very important mentor and friend in his life. After finishing school, Escher traveled extensively throughout Italy, and he eventually settled in Rome, where he stayed with his wife until 1935. During these 11 years, Escher would travel each year throughout Italy, drawing and sketching for the various prints he would make when he returned home.



Escher visited the Alhambra Palace in Spain in the 1920s and this was the turning point in his life and his art. He was fascinated with the designs throughout the Palace, and his focus turned to Tessellations. A tessellation is a collection of shapes called tiles that fit together without gaps or overlaps to cover the mathematical plane.

Although Escher was a graphic artist, he did much to influence the mathematics world because of his tessellations. He could be considered the ‘Father’ of Tessellations. M.C. Escher made 448 lithographs, woodcuts and wood engravings and over 2000 drawings and sketches during his lifetime. Like some of his famous predecessors, - Michelangelo and Leonardo da Vinci, M.C. Escher was left-handed.
