Minutes:

The minutes from January 2016 were read and approved.

Treasurer Report:

Family Events is looking good but the Daughter Dance expenses and costs haven't been documented yet. We are thinking we made about a \$1500 profit. There was a great turn out for the event. There is a big deposit for Scrip in the queue. We also have a CD that is maturing in a week that we will let roll over. It was discussed if we should invest \$500 in stock market and decided we would not at this time.

Volunteer Coordinator Report:

For January of 2015, we logged 691 hours of volunteer time and for January of 2016, we've logged 708 hours. For February 2016 so far we've logged 468 hours of volunteer time. Last year for February 2015, we logged a total of 710 hours of volunteer time. The Treasurer is looking for someone to shadow her next year since it will be her last year.

Specialty Fundraisers:

The next Burgerville night is February 23rd. The Mango Tango fundraiser will be Friday, March 11th which is a no school day. McMenamins raised \$857 which is low.

Hearing Screening:

February 24th is the Hearing Screening day and we are looking for 2 volunteers to help in the morning.

Auction:

We have 145 attendees so far. An email went out asking for guests meal choice. We are good on buy-in parties and donations. Dan Busch is all set to be the DJ. The event starts at 5:30pm with happy hour. We are looking for volunteers to help set up and clean up. Volunteers from Alberta Rider Elementary are running our check-in and check-out process and we will help them with their Carnival in the Spring. Target is also sending 5 volunteers to help with set up. We have about 50 kids signed up for the babysitting event at the school for the evening. The Johns Incredible Pizza bear will be coming and there will be pizza and games.

Art Lit:

The next project will be Quilters and the kids will be using oil pastels and mineral oils to create "quilt squares." The following project will be Origami and Kayleen Mendenthal will be running that. We are looking for co-chairs for next year and are always looking for parents to volunteer to take on a project or help in anyway.

Box Tops:

The current contest ends on March 16th and right now Miller, Rice, and White are in the lead.

Carnival:

The carnival is set for June 3rd. We will be having a meeting coming up. The theme is Splish Splash Beach Bash. We are looking for volunteers to help with ticket sales. About 1000 people come. Unfortunately there will be no dunk tank or traditional bounce houses this year due to new district rules.

Principal's Report:

Mr. Nihill is a member of the Long Range Facility Planning Committee and there will be a bond coming up next November. Enrollment will be going up in our area because of new housing developments going up on the back side of Bull Mt off 150th as well as near the Roshak area. There will be a new elementary school built off Beef Bend which will cost 32 million to build. Templeton needs to be refurbished because of its "open campus" style. Tigard High School needs renovations as well as redoing Mary Woodward's office area for better security. Twality and Fowler both need improvements too. There will be two ways the bond could be set at. One is for 240 million and that would maintain the current situation. Or the second would be for 284 million and that would cover all the needs. The district is also looking into an option to invest in Darkwire which is an internet service company that could replace Comcast. It's a 20 million dollar investment now that we'd see savings in 10-15 years as opposed to staying with Comcast who's rates continue to increase.

President's Report:

The Eagle Mingle's have had low attendance so we are considering not holding them any more. It was an experiment to see if there was interest.
